## **Pupil Premium Allocation 2015/16**

The pupil premium is allocated to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals at any time in the last 6 years or children who have been looked after (in care) for 6 months or longer.

The money is based on FSM register at the Annual Census in January of each year.

### **How we are spending our Pupil Premium Grant during 2015-16:**

- Catch-up and keep-up sessions. Children who have not achieved the learning objective are given extra sessions by the class teacher or the teaching assistant to help them to catch up and achieve their targets. These are in literacy and numeracy lessons and called “interventions”.
- Better Reading Partners. This is a reading programme to help children who need extra support with their reading. Out trained BRP teaching assistant targets children in Y1 and Y2, however if there are significant difficulties with a child at KS2 then they will have access to this programme. [Every Child a Reader was used until July 2015].
- Staff have been trained to deliver Switch-on and Catch-up for maths and reading. Switch on has been implemented from September 2015 with target children. Catch-Up Maths was implemented in the summer term 2016 and Catch-up reading from September 2016.
- Speech and language interventions. These are carried out through a programme called Talk Boost and Early Talk Boost.
- Behaviour interventions [tailored to meet the needs of the pupil]. These are carried out by our lead behaviour professional.
- The lead behaviour professional is a trained 1,2,3 Magic facilitator. She works with children, parents and staff to implement the strategies to support challenging behaviour at home and school.
- Read Write Inc programme in Reception, Y1 and Y2 small group tuition led by teachers and teaching assistants to continue to improve standards in Reading and Writing.
- Read Write Inc intervention groups for those in KS2 who need extra support/new to the country.
- Additional iPads purchased for KS2.
- From September 2015, some of the funding has been used to employ an apprentice in FS to help to narrow the gap in the FS and support with early literacy and numeracy.
- Small groups for Mega maths and Super SPAG sessions led by teachers and teaching assistants. These are for all pupils in KS1 and KS2 .
- An additional part –time teacher is partly funded to carry out small group boosters in UKS2.

- Social, Emotional and Mental Health Needs training has been undertaken and staff are working closely with target children to further support their personal development and well-being.
- DP children take part in sporting events with other Cheshire East schools.
- Booster sessions for pupils at risk of not achieving their potential.

### **How we will spend our Pupil Premium Grant in 2016-2017:**

- Lead behaviour professional to work with targeted children.
- Lead behaviour professional to work with families and deliver parent workshops.
- Catch up and keep up sessions for reading. Children who have not achieved the learning objective are given extra sessions by the class teacher or the teaching assistant to help them to catch up and achieve their targets.
- Catch up and keep up sessions for mathematics. Children who have not achieved the learning objective are given extra sessions by the class teacher or the teaching assistant to help them to catch up and achieve their targets.
- Enrichment activities.
- Early Talk Boost and Talk Boost programmes delivered in FS and KS1.
- Free blazers for pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium and reduced price for school trips.
- Booster sessions for children at risk of not achieving their potential.
- Booster sessions for more able children to assist them to reach higher attaining levels.
- Purchase of resources to support numeracy and literacy skills.
- Employment of an additional adult to deliver sport during the lunch time.
- Attendance and welfare support.
- Read, write Inc programme in reception, Y1 and Y2 [small group tuition] to continue to raise standards in reading and writing. Some KS2 children also access this programme.
- English support for our EAL children, to enable them to access the curriculum.
- Emotional support for those EAL children who do not speak any English. This helps them to integrate with other children and to learn the rules of the school.
- Buying in Speech and Language Therapist to assess pupils and write programmes for support staff to deliver.
- Maths and SPaG small group tuition to continue to raise standards in literacy and numeracy.
