From September 2017 we will be making some small changes to our current school uniform policy. We are letting you know now so you have plenty of notice to implement the changes ready for September 2017.

From September 2017 we will no longer permit **white** polo shirts or **white** shirts or any form of **grey/charcoal** trousers, skirts or pinafore dresses. Girls are required to wear **black** tights not grey. When purchasing your child's uniform from September please try and match the school colours for example please buy a navy blue jumper/cardigan not royal blue, black or grey.

None of the school uniform with the Edleston Logo on will change. Please see the website for a price list. You can purchase all of our requested uniform from Tesco, George, M&S, Aldi and other good retailers that stock school uniform. No trainers are permitted in school unless these are requested for PE. You will be asked by text/letter if this is the case.

We and our schools governing body feel that this small change is in the best interest of our children. If all of our children have similar uniform in the same colours this is much smarter especially when the children are representing Edleston on trips or in the community.
