The e-safety questionnaire was returned by 59 parents, so thanks to all those who took a few minutes to help us ensure that school is doing the up most we can for the children, regarding Safety online.

The results showed the following findings:

Positives -

Most children are using the internet to play games online. Closely followed studying or homework help. It is clear that as Parents you have chatted with the children about how to keep safe online, report incidents and what to do if there are any issues whilst online. We are all aware of the privacy settings and how to control them as adults.

Areas to work on -

- Quite a few are also using it for Social media and keeping in touch with others.
- Sharing the privacy settings and how to keep them safe with the children.
- Knowing the SMART e-safety rules, from school, as adults.
- Attending parent’s meetings run by school or outside agencies.
- Developing closer links between school and parents.
